



Hello HRMS Families:

One word that comes to mind at this point is the year is, “stamina.” We have under 20 days left in the school year. We are all working hard and I am confident that as a school community we can finish out in a strong fashion. As previously communicated and in line with recommendations from DESE we are not using traditional letter grades for trimester 3. Instead faculty will use designations based upon student connection and participation in remote learning. Students will receive designations of either PRL = participated in remote learning or DNP = did not participate in remote learning. Additionally, teachers have comments they can use to help measure the effectiveness of student performance during this time.

We also want to announce plans for students to retrieve items from their lockers and classrooms. HRMS administrators will clean out student lockers and label them so that students can get any items currently in school. Families will be able to come to school and pick them up outside of the building. Here is the schedule for pick up of items.

Wednesday June 10th is the student items pick-up for grade seven.

We invite families to pull up using the traffic loop during their scheduled time. Staff will be on hand to distribute the items.

PowerSchool Monitoring - Keeping Track of Your Child's Progress Trimester 3

As a reminder, in order to keep track of your child's work completion for Trimester 3, please log in to PowerSchool and click on each individual class to see which assignments are marked as completed or missing. Since teachers will not be posting individual letter grades, you will need to click on the T3 column where there is an (i) listed for each class. Once you click on the "i", you will see each assignment accompanied by a green checkmark ✓ (completed work) or an orange exclamation point !
